## castella: a SAT-based system for solving the path counting problem

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Castella is a SAT-based system for solving the path counting problem (PCP). The task of PCP is to count all paths that satisfy certain constraints on a given graph (i.e., all solutions of a path finding problem). We develop a constraint modeling that represents path finding problems as constraint satisfaction problems (CSPs). Figure 1 shows the architecture of castella. The castella solver generates a CSP for a given PCP instance of an extended DIMACS format, and then translates it into SAT by using Sugar [1].<sup>1</sup> In turn, the total number of paths is calculated by using SAT model counting solvers, in our case GPMC [2].<sup>2</sup>
